1. OPENING OF THE MEETING, PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

The President of the ESH, K. Tsioufis, opened the Assembly meeting on Sunday, 10 June 2018 at 13:00, welcomed the delegates and thanked them all for their attendance. Overall, about 80 ESH members attended the meeting.

2. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

K. Tsioufis highlighted in his introduction to his report ESH's major achievement in the last year. He pointed out that despite some difficulties the 2018 European Guidelines were successfully presented at this ESH 2018 Annual Meeting. K. Tsioufis thanked the two chairs G. Mancia and B. Williams and all the members of the Task Force members for their excellent contribution and efforts in preparing the Guideline publication.

K. Tsioufis informed the delegates of a new initiative to strengthen relationships between ESH and the National Societies. A series of individual meetings, 25 in total, with the Presidents of the National Societies have been organized each morning over the three days of the Annual Meeting.

3. TREASURER'S REPORT

M. Burnier on behalf of M. Bochud, ESH Treasurer, presented the audited financial situation of the ESH and the Foundation of the ESH for the financial year at 31 December, 2017. No comments or objectives were raised from the audience.

4. ESH BY-LAWS UPDATE

R. Kreutz presented the updated ESH By-laws to the delegates. These replace the existing by-laws dated 2002. The update of the by-laws was initiated during the Council meeting in Glasgow at Septemer 30, 2018, and the updated drafts have been generated over the past several months and were presented to the ESH Scientific Council during the meeting on Friday, 8 June 2018. This update was unanimously accepted by the Council.

No objections were raised by the Council. A summary of this presenation is shown below.


ESH BY-LAWS UPDATE 2018: procedure

- Approval from General Assembly requested on Sunday June 10, 13:00-13:30

ARTICLE VI



ESH BY-LAWS UPDATE 2018 What is new - 1



Article II – Purpose

4. The ESH supports a Foundation (FESH) in order to achieve its purpose, especially but not limited to grant financial assistance for educational and research purposes. The ESH shall donate to FESH any surplus which are not necessary for achieving its purpose.

Article III – Members

- 1. Membership in the ESH is open to physicians and any health care professionals worldwide.
- 2. Election of Members. Applicants are required to apply online at the website of the ESH c) letters of endorsement are not required.

7. Corporate membership

Institutions or companies interested in the support of hypertension research or management may become corporate members. Each corporate member has one vote at the General Assembly.

Article IV – Scientific Council, Officers, Committees and Governing bodies

4. Ex-Officio Members

Ex-Officio non-voting members of the Scientific Council are:

- a) one ESH members designated by the International Society of Hypertension
- b) one ESH member representing FESH
- c) one ESH member representing National Hypertension Societies

7. Awards Committee

The Committee will be chaired by the President of the Society (or a delagate nominated by him from among the Scientific Council members), the Secretary of the Society and at least 3 other members nominated by the Council. This Committee will review the availability and financial support of ESH awards for each year. The Committee will provide



Following the presentation by R. Kreutz, the delegates voted unanimously to approve the ESH By-laws Update 2018.

5. ESH 2022 BID WINNER ANNOUNCEMENT

Prof. Agabiti Rosei reported how the selection of the City was carried out; this included a score sheet that was used during an independent evaluation of by the selection committee members. After careful review of the presentations from the three candidate cities, Athens, Hamburg and Stockholm and further deliberation by the Selection Committee, E. Agabiti Rosei announced that Athens had won the bid by fulfilling the majority number of criteria used for the selection.

6. ELECTION OF NOMINATED NEW ESH MEMBERS

R. Kreutz informed the delegates that 156 new members had nominated from 55 countries, 38 European and 17 non-European countries. The new members were invited to attend the Welcome to New Members meeting to be held immediately after the General Assembly to receive their membership certificate.

7. BRIEF REPORT ON

a. ESH WORKING GROUPS

G. Parati gave a brief overview on the ESH Working Groups. Currently there are 12 Working Groups and he confirmed the change of name of the Working Group on Hypertension, Thrombosis and Arrhythmias to Working Group on Hypertension and the Heart.

b. ESH SPECIALIST PROGRAMME

M. Azizi underlined the need for hypertension specialists and the need to promote hypertension to young physicians. The ESH has 1086 clinical hypertension specialists from 51 countries worldwide.

c. ESH EXCELLENCE CENTRES IN HYPERTENSION

B. Jelakovic informed the delegates that 4 new Excellence Centres were nominated during the Annual Meeting. He invited all ESH Excellence Centres to take part in the ESH BP Control Study.

d. ESH SUMMER SCHOOLS

R. Cifkova gave a brief overview of the ESH Summer Schools. The number of participants over the last 10 years has been stable, on an average between 50-70 physicians. Over the last few years many applications from non-European countries have been received. The 2018 Summer School will be held in Les Diablerets, Switzerland, 7-13 September, in Greece, near Athens in 2019 and in Serbia in 2020.
